



Marion Miley – 1991

Marion Miley captured six Women's Kentucky Amateur Championships over an eight year period (1931, 1932, 1934, 1935, 1937, and 1938). She was named to the United States Curtis Cup Team in 1936 and 1938, and was considered among the best women golfers in the United States and the world during that time. Her life ended tragically in 1941 when, at the age of 27, she was killed during a robbery at Lexington Country Club, where her father served as the head golf professional. The club has hosted the Marion Miley Invitational Golf Tournament as a tribute to her achievements, and event has become one of the most coveted titles in women's amateur golf in Kentucky.
